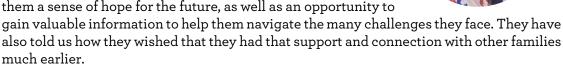


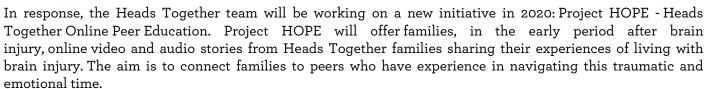
Project Hope

Tali Train Research Project



Are seeking families for a study on attention and childhood brain injury

Researchers at Monash University and the Murdoch Children's Research Institute are interested in understanding whether a game-based attention training program can strengthen attention in children who have experienced an acquired brain injury (ABI).

Who can participate? Children aged 4 - 9 years who have experienced an ABI are invited to take part in this research.

What is involved? Children will complete a training program at home over 5 weeks, as well as attending sessions at MCRI to measure changes in attention, memory, social and academic skills.
